- Input statements (approximately 5 min.) by invited and briefed experts will be presented to the hall as an introduction to the respective topic,
- Experienced co-moderators are responsible for ensuring that an interactive debate takes place as early as possible,
- Written statements (including longer ones) by experts can be brought in, photo-copied and distributed in advance (this would also be useful for interpreters),
- Additional materials can be laid out on an information table in the foyer (additional background information, flyers, etc.).

As last year, the Swiss-IGF 2017 will be held in three languages - German, French and English - with simultaneous translation (except for workshops / side rooms).
